- Hepatic encephalopathy is a potentially lethal complication of end stage liver disease, with treatment options limited mainly to lactulose. Last November, Health Canada approved an oral antibiotic, Rifaximin, with minimal systemic absorption to reduce colonic bacteria. Will this new option improve outcomes for cirrhotic patients? This presentation will focus on lactulose as compared to, or in addition to, rifaximin for treatment and prevention of recurrence of hepatic encephalopathy
